What is the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA)?

- MHSA was enacted when voters approved Proposition 63 in 2004.
- Imposes a 1 percent income tax on personal income in excess of one million dollars. The funding is distributed to counties upon approval of MHSA Plans and subsequently on an annual basis
- MHSA provides funds, personnel and other resources for local mental health services
- Services focus on wellness and recovery as well as prevention, and early intervention for target populations, including children, transition age youth, adults, older adults and families.

Driving Principles for MHSA

- Community collaboration
- Cultural competence
- Client driven mental health system
- Family driven mental health system.


Driving Principles for MHSA

- Wellness, recovery and resiliency focus
- Integrated service experience
- Outreach to unserved and underserved populations
- Utilize best practices and evidence based strategies to deliver mental health services.

Five MHSA Components

- 1. Community Services & Support (CSS)
- 2. Prevention & Early Intervention (PEI)
- 3. Capital Facilities and Technology (Cap/IT)
- 4. Workforce Education & Training (WET)
- 5. Innovation (INN).

MHSA Components



MHSA Community Program Planning Process

MHSA Steering Committee held six meetings.

MHSA Stakeholders held four meetings.

Local Mental Health Board provided monthly update.

MHSA Community Program Planning Process

- Cultural Competence Committee, Quality Improvement Committee, Psychiatric Emergency Services Committee and Solano Coalition for Better Health.
- Various community meetings: Integrated Family Service Initiative, Early Childhood Developmental/Mental Health Collaborative, and etc.

Public Comment and Public Hearing Process

- MHSA FY 2011-12 Annual Update was posted for 30 day Public Comment period from February 7, 2011 to March 8, 2011.
- Public Hearing is March 15, 2011 at 2101 Courage Drive, Multi-Purpose Room, Fairfield, CA.
- The MHSA FY 2011-12 Annual Update will be submitted to DMH by April 15, 2011.

Overview of MHSA FY 2011-12 Annual Update

- The Solano County Mental Health, MHSA Strategic Plan continues to provide the framework and tools for planning.
- More than half of MHSA CSS funds are directed to Full Service Partnerships per regulations.
- A 25%+/- in the budget requires the program to be reported as *new* per guidelines.

MHSA Fiscal Forecast: Funds Decreasing

Fiscal Year (FY)	CSS	PEI	INN
FY 2009-10	\$9.1m	\$3.2m	\$718k
FY 2010-11	\$7.9m	\$2.1m	\$1.2m
FY 2011-12	\$7.5m	\$1.8m	\$493k
FY 2012-13	\$5.9m	\$1.2m	\$390k

SCMH developed Financial Plan: utilizing reserve funds to offset decreases to MHSA funds FY 11-12.

MHSA FY 2011-12 Annual Update CSS Highlights

- Continue Full Service Partnerships for each target age group: children, transition age youth, adults and older adults.
- Continue Psychiatric Emergency Team, Foster Family/Bilingual Support, Wellness and Recovery Services, and Outreach & Engagement.
- New Program: Crisis Stabilization & Hospitalization Alternative Placement.

MHSA FY 2011-12 Annual Update WET Highlights

- Continue original programs in the WET Plan, including:
 - Cultural Competence training and education.
 - Implement evidence based practices in SCMH.
 - Build consumer/family member staff.
 - Recruit and retain bilingual/bicultural workforce.
 - Implement local loan assumption program.

MHSA FY 2011-12 Annual Update PEI Highlights

- Continue target age group initiatives: including, Children 0-5, School Age Children, Transition Age Youth and Older Adults.
- Continue augmentations: including, Behavioral Health and Primary Care Integration and Wellness and Recovery Support Services.

MHSA Annual Update: Technology Highlights

- Submitting an Update to the MHSA FY 2009-10 Annual Update to request funds for Technology.
- Requesting about \$2.4 million to procure and launch an Electronic Health Record system in Solano County.

MHSA FY 2011-12 Annual Update: Public Comment

- One public comment was received about decrease in PEI funds, and as a result, a decrease to PEI contracts.
- Clarified that SCMH created a financial plan: local and prudent reserves will offset the decrease in MHSA funds.

MHSA FY 2011-12 Annual Update: Next Steps

- Public Hearing is March 15, 2011 at 2101 Courage Drive, Fairfield, CA.
- MHSA Stakeholder and Steering Committee meeting March 23, 2011.
- Submit MHSA FY 2011-12 Annual Update by April 15, 2011 to California Department of Mental Health (DMH) and Mental Health Services Oversight and Accountability Commission (OAC).
- DMH/OAC approval by July 1, 2011 and local funds dispersed to county coffers.
