

ARTICLE II. SERVICE FEES FOR WEIGHING AND MEASURING DEVICES

Sec. 32-20. Commercial fees; Requested testing

Pursuant to § 12210.5 of the Business and Professions Code of the state, the board of supervisors of the County of Solano may authorize the sealer or the sealer's designated representative to charge and collect the fees prescribed by the director of the department of food and agriculture of the State of California, for inspections and tests of commercial weighing and measuring devices requested by the owner-user of the device(s). The request shall be in writing and the inspection and test shall be in addition to the prescribed frequency of inspections specified in the California Code of Regulations, Chapter 3, Article 1, Section 4070, Table 1, entitled Frequency of Inspections. The fees shall be adopted by resolution of the board of supervisors and amended as needed to conform to the uniform schedule of fees as established by the director of the department of food and agriculture.

Sec. 32-21. Noncommercial fees; Requested testing

The board of supervisors of County of Solano may adopt by resolution a schedule of fees for calibrating, testing, and/or certifying noncommercial weighing and measuring devices and their accessories pursuant to § 12210(b) of the Business and Professions Code of the state. The noncommercial services must be requested in writing by the owner-user of the device(s). The sealer or the sealer's designated representative is authorized to charge and collect the prescribed fees.

Sec. 32-22. Miscellaneous fees; Requested services

At the discretion of the sealer or the sealer's designated representative, specific services requested in writing may be performed utilizing standards and equipment owned by the county to assist agencies or businesses with safety tests, strain tests, etc., as may be required of them. The board of supervisors may adopt by resolution fees to recover the costs of such services and authorize the sealer or the sealer's designated representative to charge and collect the fees.
