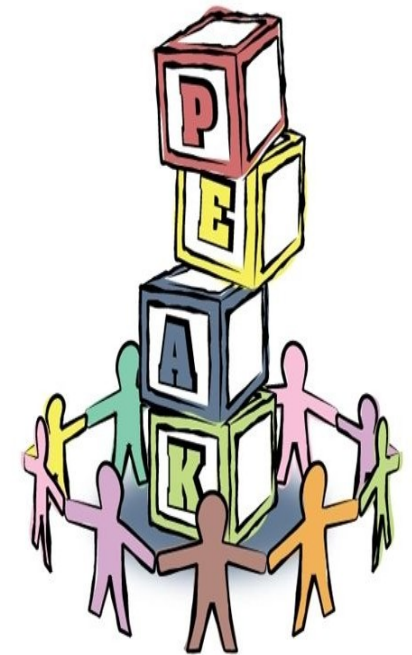

# PARTNERSHIP FOR EARLY ACCESS FOR KIDS

**The P.E.A.K Initiative** is a unique new service that encourages families and providers to understand the developmental needs of children from birth to 5 years of age. The initiative offers developmental screening and referrals to supportive services as appropriate.

## **P.E.A.K. includes:**

### **Two lead agencies:**

- ◆ **Children's Nurturing Project**
- ◆ **EMQ FamiliesFirst**

### **Four partner agencies:**

- ◆ **Youth and Family Services**
- ◆ **Child Start, Inc.**
- ◆ **Solano Family and Children Services**
- ◆ **Dixon Family Services**

**AND, the support of** multiple service partners and in-kind matches – all of which are integral to the overall success of this system-wide redesign.

P.E.A.K. is committed to the common goal of achieving earlier identification of children with special needs to help improve their developmental potential when they enter Kindergarten.

**P.E.A.K.** includes **5** separate but coordinated service strategies:

- ◆ **Parent/Caregiver Education**
- ◆ **Provider Education and Training**
- ◆ **Screening and Assessment**
- ◆ **Parent Coaching**
- ◆ **Limited Short Term Treatment**

Families will be referred to other services and community resources based on their individual needs.
