I. Welcome and Introductions	Jayleen Richards opened with a welcome and introductions took place around the room	
II. Brief Recap of First Meeting	Mike Oprendek provided a recap of Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) key principles. Also, Mr. Oprendek urged MHSA Steering Committee to keep as a goal Mental Health (MH) consumers' reintegration into the community—a wellness and recovery model of services. Mike also provided a budget update.: • The Board of Supervisors passed 2009-10 FY budget that included \$4.6 million reduction to Mental Health • There were no layoffs in Solano County Mental Health, but 30 positions that were vacant were eliminated. • This year marks the 2 nd year of coming in on budget in Solano County Mental Health (SCMH).	 Are there any budget decisions made about Prop36? No, not yet. Rev. Fuentes – Since I was part of the last Steering Committee how do we know that any of the plans that were developed before did or did not work. How can we look at the information in order to incorporate in the new process? We will provide you with as much of that information as possible, e.g. the original MHSA Plan & last two MHSA Plan updates, as well as MHSA and MH data to inform the process. Is the committee going to target unserved & underserved populations? An MHSA principle is reaching out to unserved and underserved populations. Will we be looking at more than just ethnicity?

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II. Brief Recap of First Meeting	The following services will be impacted by the 2009- 10 FY State Budget reductions: 1. Early Periodic Screening Diagnostic Test Program 2. Managed Care 3. Public Health Programs 4. CalWORKs 5. Also, the state budget (2009-10 FY) includes deferral of payments to counties. Mr. Oprendek closed by asking the committee to look at — What we are funding and why? What did we originally set out for this plan to do? Outcomes & measures developed by the MHSA Steering Committee should focus on & measure mental health outcomes—not all social ills. Jayleen Richards reviewed notes from 6/30/09 and reinstated the purpose of MHSA Steering Committee Follow up from 6/30/09 mtg: • MHSA is required to have a prudent reserve. DMH is issuing a new prudent reserve policy notice – expected to be released summer 2009 (draft version provided to Steering Committee members). • The new prudent reserve policy will instruct counties about how to access the prudent reserve. In three years, DMH plans to revise the requirement of 50% of CSS 2009-10 FY funds in the prudent reserve.	SCMH staff/consultant are here to help the MHSA Steering Committee to help facilitate the process; the MHSA Steering Committee drives the process and recommends to SCMH the direction and scope of the MHSA Strategic Planning.

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III. Strategic Planning and Performance Accountability	 Lynn DeLapp reviewed Mark Friedman's Accountability Process (see presentation). Solano County cannot solely be held responsible for the health of all people who live here, but the county will be held accountable for their clients and their individual outcomes The committee discussed the data that were collected previously to address the MHSA principle of unserved and underserved populations. 	Is this committee a function of MHSA? Will the committee just be looking at the MHSA portion or everything that has to be done? • The Committee may go beyond MHSA to find out how the SCMH continuum of care will make sense What are the Mental Health Core mandated programs? • SCMH will provide to the MHSA Steering Committee (Jayleen).
	 Lynn reviewed MHSA Target Population for Community Services and Support (please see handout). 	
IV. Small Work Group	 The MHSA Steering Committee & Work Groups will focus on needs instead of funds Committee determined whether to split by age or by service, and decided to split by age, e.g. children, young adults, adults, older adults. The committee volunteered leads for each work group. Committee members decided which group they will participate in (see below) Each age group will focus on all three services, including Clinics, Mobile Crisis, and Wellness & Recovery 	The group suggested to ask Neighborhood of Dreams to participate in the committee (Sanjida, Joseph, and Bob) Should FSP offer everything for everyone involved and can you define FSP? • See FSP (document from 1st meeting) & DMH handout re: FSP Frequently Asked Questions. SCMH contact workgroup leads and ask for availability. Meet at least once by Aug. 26th.
