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2) After closing the noticed/published hearing, adopt the attached Fee Resolutions amending the Solano County Code that modifies and establishes various fees for the departments listed above and authorizes enactment of fees by Resolution, effective July 1, 2010 for all departments.

SUMMARY:

This is the annual submission of countywide user Fee Schedules updates and changes. In support of Board policy that user fees be based on 100% cost recovery, the County Administrator's Office facilitates and supports County departments in the update of their fees on an annual basis. At this time 20 established fee exhibits included in Chapter 11 of the Solano County Code are being revised to reflect salary/benefit and programmatic changes. Also it is recommended to include the department of Human Resources' proposed fees (Exhibit XVIII) and consider adoption of their fees by separate resolution.

If all fees are approved by the Board, County departments will recover approximately an additional \$451,800 annually. A summary of the proposed FY2010/11 fee changes, including new fees, are listed by Departments (Attachment A). Resolutions for adopting the revised Fee Schedules include corresponding listing of all fees (Attachment B). With adoption of the department Fee Resolutions (Attachment B), the new and revised fees will be effective July 1, 2010.

FINANCING:

The table below provides the increased revenues anticipated from the approval of the proposed fee changes.

^{*} Please note that although the Probation Department is increasing certain fees, the Department's projected fee revenues for FY2010/11 are projected to decrease. See Attachment A for more details.

The cost of preparing annual fee increases is borne by the departments within their existing budgets. Each department will project the increased revenue anticipated from the approval of the proposed fee changes in their FY2010/11 budget.

DISCUSSION:

Since 1991, Solano County departments have used a standardized cost methodology for countywide user fees. Fees are developed and recommended to adhere to the Board of Supervisors' policy to recover 100% of the costs associated with a service provided by the county to members of the public when allowed by law. The basic fee methodology is as follows:

Direct Costs + Indirect Costs = Total Cost of Services

While there are exceptions to the above policy (based on market factors which would show a decline in demand if the costs of the fees were excessive), each department's goal is to have 100% cost recovery whenever possible. Increased revenues anticipated from the attached resolutions will be incorporated into each department's FY2010/11 budget.

The Auditor-Controller's staff reviewed the propriety of the methodology used by each department in the calculation of the department's fees when the fee involved determining a productive hourly rate. They concurred that the methodology is sound for calculating fees and validated the departments' calculations. The Auditor-Controller's staff did not review the statutory fees.

Modifications to the fee schedules are predominately the result of cost-of-living and benefit adjustments, such as health insurance costs. In some cases, departments have reduced specific fees to adjust for the actual costs of providing services. Obsolete fees have been eliminated and new fees have been established according to each department's circumstances. Each department's fee exhibit, by means of check marks in the New Fee or Revised Fee columns, reflects changes to existing fees (addition of new fees, increases/decreases, deletions, consolidations, etc.). All other fees have not been changed from the previously Board approved fee amount.

Also, as mentioned above regarding exceptions to the Board's recovery policy, staff recommends that the Agricultural Department's fees increase incrementally. In order to attain a 100% cost recovery for services provided, their fees would increase over 12%, which may result in a decline in demand for their services. Farm operations are located in both Yolo County and Solano County allowing for either county to provide certain services. Phasing in the increased fees will lessen the potential loss in revenue of farmers seeking services from Yolo County. Staff recommends a 6% increase, an estimated \$9,300 increase in annual revenues in FY2010/11 with the remaining adjustment to occur in FY2011/12.

Emergency Medical Services (EMS) has included their fee schedule as information only for the Board. The local EMS agency has the authority to establish fees for Emergency Medical

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Technician certification and recertification. The Solano Emergency Medical Services Cooperative (SEMSC) is the local EMS agency that has the responsibility of setting and approving the EMS fee schedule.

A summary of the proposed FY2010/11 fee changes, including new fees, are listed by department in Attachment A.

ALTERNATIVES:

- 1. The Board may choose to not approve any of the new or proposed fee increases. This alternative is not recommended, as it would result in the loss of approximately \$451,800 in revenues for FY2010/11.
- The Board may choose to approve fees by individual departments after directing the various departments to modify either the new proposed fees or the proposed increased fees. If the Board chooses not to implement certain fees, this will directly impact revenue for any affected department.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The County Administrator Office, in developing the new and updated fees as detailed in Exhibit I through XVIII, worked with the following departments: Agricultural Commissioner/Sealer of Weights and Measures, Assessor/Recorder, Resource Management (including Environmental Health, Planning, Building and Safety, Administrative Services and Public Works), Treasurer/Tax Collector/County Clerk, Auditor-Controller, Registrar of Voters, Clerk of the Board, County Administrator's Office, Health and Human Services, Public Defender, Sheriff, Probation, Library, General Services (including Animal Care Services and Parks & Recreation) and Human Resources. In addition, a public notice of the proposed fee increases was sent to all parties requesting notification under California Government Code Section 66016.
